wife & child went to visit mother in Holstein IA accompanied by sister,
Hattie Metzger, June 1891

C M. went to GI to buy scrap iron for foundry

Dislocated his ankle Oct. 15, 1892

A reference in ad for Goodson Gold Cure for the Liquor Habit (Jan 1893)

F. M. Kuhn, bass in Midway orchestra (June 1891)

Frank Kuhn to play bass viol in Midway Orchestra (Oct. 23, 1894)

George H. Kuhn – wife & children returned home June 15, 1892

Robert (Bob) Kuhn - Bob Kuhn returning from Council Bluffs with a wife, Aug 2, 1889

wife nee Metzger (June 1891)

On entertainment comm.. for cotton mill opening celebration, Feb 9, 1892

Walter W Kuhn – vp of corporation owning plow factory, the man in charge

Went to Omaha - Dec. 10, 1891, Mar. 5, 1892

Went to Omaha and on to Chicago, Apr. 19, 1892, returned May 17, 1892

Moved into a house in Kenwood corner of 7th Ave & 18th St.

Telephone installed, June 17, 1892, #98

Went to Omaha, Apr 10, 1893

Went to Gothenburg, May 1893

Went east, May 28, 1893

Selling “Koaline” a compound which makes \$7 worth of coal do as much as \$10 worth.

Opened an office in the Evans building downtown, Nov 22, 1893

Advertised for help to make the compound, Nov 25. 1893

Went to Hastings about sale of Koaline, Feb. 10 & 26, 1894

Richard W. Kuhn – brother of Walter

Hull & Kuhn Bros Iron Works delivered iron to cotton mill, June 13, 1891

received load of junk from GI, June 23, 1891

Kuhn Bros. developed a vice & anvil combination to sell to farmers Oct 1891

Interviewed & asked when they were going to tear down the buildings on Central which
were damaged by fire
